

### **Environmental Communications Internship**

Citizens for a Safe & Clean Lake Superior is hiring a communications intern for the upcoming winter semester! Citizens is a local environmental advocacy nonprofit focused on protecting the Lake Superior shoreline and watershed in Marquette County from environmental threats from any person or group.

**Term:** 1/12/2026 - 4/25/2026, with possibility of extending into following semesters.

**Compensation:** \$500 award per semester

**Hours:** 5-10 hours per week, with flexibility around the intern's class schedule and holidays. The intern will meet with CSCLS staff on a weekly basis.

**Duties typically include:**

- Creating digital communications materials as needed using Canva or equivalent. This will include regular social media posts and may also include event posters, email messages, reports, summaries, letters to the editor, or other written materials.
- Collaboratively managing the organization's social media communications schedule.
- Communicating environmental issues, representing the organization, and answering questions at public events
- Other tasks as assigned, based on the intern's skills and interests.

**The ideal candidate will:**

- Be currently enrolled at Northern Michigan University
- Have a strong interest in local environmental issues and protecting the Lake Superior watershed
- Have a strong interest in environmental advocacy and communications
- Possess strong communications skills, including writing and in-person communication
- Have comfortability designing in Canva or other design softwares
